

SAFETY MOBILE APPLICATIONS

The following are some safety apps you may find useful to the work you do. Most of the apps listed here are free, and new ones are being developed all the time.

Best Built Plans (Simcoach Games, free): Provides contractors and workers with practical tools and information to plan for safe materials handling while staying productive and profitable.

CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, free): Access the most up to date health news and information.

Chemical Hazards Pocket Guide (ThatsMyStapler Inc., free): The industrial hygiene information assists users to recognize and control occupational chemical hazards. Content is sourced from NIOSH® Publication No. 2010-168c.

Chemical Safety Data Sheets – ICSC (ThatsMyStapler Inc., free): International Chemical Safety Cards produced by the United Nations Environment Programme, the International Labour Office, and the World Health Organization.

Decibel X PRO - Sound Meter dBA, Noise Detector (SkyPaw Co. Ltd, free): Professional noise meter precisely measures the sound pressure level (SPL) all around you.

Emergency Alerts – American Red Cross (American Red Cross, free): Lets you monitor more than 35 different severe weather and emergency alerts to help keep you and your loved ones safe.

EMR Guide (National Safety Council, free): Designed to support those people who have completed NSC's Emergency Medical Response training course, but this ready reference can be a lifesaving tool for anyone.

Ladder Safety (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, free): Features a multimodal indicator to assist the user in positioning a ladder at an optimal angle, and provides graphic-oriented interactive reference materials, safety guidelines, and checklists for extension and step ladders selection, inspection, accessorizing, and use.

SDS Binderworks (Trilix, membership required): Remote access to the SDS BinderWorks website.

SDS Mobile (Online-MSDS.com by KHA, free): Database of safety data sheets (SDS).

Weather Bug – Weather Forecast (WeatherBug, free): Delivers alerts and real-time forecasts from storm warnings to pollen levels (current, hourly, and 10-day).

Windy.com (Windyty, SE, free): Up-to-date weather forecast.

WISER Response (National Library of Medicine at NIH, free): Hazardous substances information including substance identification support, physical characteristics, human health information, and containment and suppression advice to assist emergency responders in hazardous material incidents.
