# **ETCP Entertainment Electrics**

Instructor: Jamie James, JJ Training Co.

Course Length: 21 hours

# **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This three-day course covers the topics listed in the content outline of the ETCP Entertainment Electrician Certification exam. The ETCP Entertainment Electrician certification encompasses the installation, interconnection, safe use, and repair of all portable distribution; utilization of entertainment-industryrelated electrical equipment; and the safe use of all venue electrical equipment. Additionally, this certification encompasses the design, layout, and interconnection of portable electrical distribution equipment, including generation, if necessary, as well as the safe connection of portable distribution feeders to fixed power sources.

This course is designed to provide technical and practical knowledge for live event production technicians working with electricity in the entertainment industry including theatres, film/TV studios and on location, arenas/stadiums/sporting events, carnivals/fairs/festivals, circuses, cruise ships, industrial/corporate events, religious events/houses of worship, theme parks, touring concerts/theatre, and other places of public assembly throughout the United States and Canada.

This course will focus on in-depth explanations and hands-on demonstrations of power and control systems with a focus on safety. By the end of the course, participants will know electrical theory and the safe installation and use of entertainment industry electrical equipment, and they will be prepared to take the ETCP Certified Entertainment Electrician exam.

# **TOPIC OUTLINE**

- 1. Electrical Skills
  - a. Apply electrical theory (calculate formulas, apply operational theory, perform operations and procedures with tools)
  - b. Hang/rig overhead equipment (calculate weight distribution, specify hanging techniques)
  - c. Set up electrical systems (PPD, generators/transformers, branch circuit wiring, feeder wiring, etc.)
  - d. Set up control systems (consoles, preset boards, computers, network systems equipment, distribution systems, etc.)
  - e. Assemble/install electrical equipment (power connectors, control cables, terminals, portable extension cords and feeder cables, distribution equipment, etc.)
  - f. Operate electrical equipment (conventional and moving light, follow spot, effects machine, motor controls, luminaire focusing and accessories)
  - g. Maintain/troubleshoot electrical equipment (luminaires and accessories, dimming and relay equipment, power distribution equipment, special effects, etc.)
- 2. Regulations, Codes, and Life Safety
  - a. Ensure compliance with local, state, and national laws, codes, standards, and permits
  - b. Follow safety procedures (electrical safety, personal protective equipment, emergency safety)
- 3. Entertainment Electrical Systems Planning
  - a. Determine power requirements (nature of loads, voltage and frequency, AC/DC, amperage, grounding, overcurrent protection, etc.)

- b. Determine the suitability of existing permanent power supply sources (service capacity, physical adequacy of tie-in panels, etc.)
- c. Determine specifications (transformers, portable power generators, overcurrent protection, cable management systems, etc.)
- d. Documentation (diagrams, lighting plots, equipment lists, etc.)
